ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Arts | 60% Average from the 5 following classes

- English Language Arts 30-1
- 3 subjects from Group A, B and/or C
- 1 subject from Group A, B, C or D
- Maximum of 2 distinct Group B subjects can be used

Science | 60% Average from the 5 following classes

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Mathematics 30-1 or Mathematics 30-2
- 2 of Biology 30, Chemistry 30 or Physics 30
- 1 subject from Group A, B, C or D

Management | 65% Average from the 5 following classes

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Mathematics 30-1 or Mathematics 30-2
- 2 subjects from Group A, B and/or C
- 1 subject from Group A, B, C or D
- Only 1 Group B subject permitted.

NOTES ABOUT GROUP D SUBJECTS

- Any credit combination of applicable Grade 12 Group D subjects will be used to make up the required 5 credits.
- Applicable Group D Subjects must be at the “3000” level.
- Only Advanced level (Career & Technology CTS) courses will be considered.
- Excludes Registered Apprenticeship Program and Special Projects 30.

JUMP START!

Grade 11 Early Admission

Students in Grade 11 wishing to enter Arts, Science, or Management at Concordia can apply to our Jump Start program. Students admitted through Jump Start will receive advanced registration priority for Fall 2014, have access to an advisor for early advising, and be assigned a student ambassador buddy.

From January 1 to June 15, 2013, students in Grade 11 can apply online to enter in Fall 2014. Applicants should present the appropriate Grade 11 courses needed for their specific program of studies and be on track to take the Grade 12 sequel courses at an equal or greater course level. All applicants will be considered for Jump Start with an admission average of 65% for Arts and Science and 72% for Management.

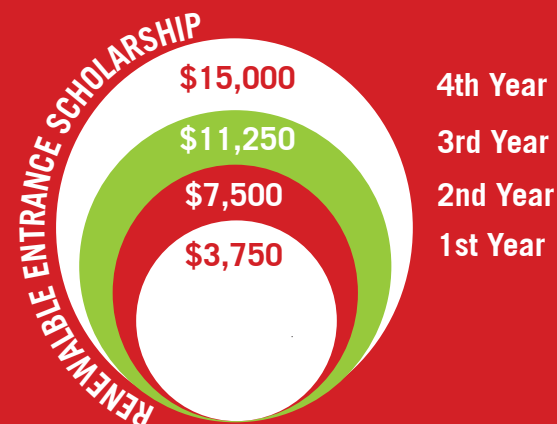
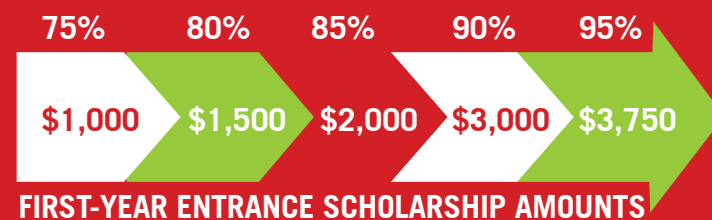
EARNING THE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships, bursaries and awards can take a large chunk out of the cost of university, and good grades can increase this chunk of the pie even more. Concordia's University Entrance Scholarship gives first-year university students up to \$15,000 based on their awards average (calculated using five Grade 12 classes selected from Groups A, B and C). This scholarship is offered to students who:

- Apply for admission before April 1, 2013
- Present a minimum awards average of 75%
- Register in 80% of a full course load

RENEWING THE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

To renew the Entrance Scholarship, students must be registered in a minimum 80% of a full-course load (12 credits) in each subsequent semester, and maintain a minimum overall GPA (3.2 GPA for all scholarships valued below \$3,000 or 3.5 GPA for scholarships valued \$3,000 or greater).

SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION

Supplemental Instruction (SI) is a peer-support learning program that uses voluntary peer-led seminar sessions to encourage active and collaborative group learning. The program targets classes with historically high fail or drop rates. Student Life & Learning implemented SI beginning this Fall and eagerly anticipates seeing the results this semester.

FIRST-YEAR LEARNING COMMUNITIES

The First-Year Learning Communities (FLC pronounced 'flicks') is an engaging, evidence-based program designed to help new Concordia students succeed academically and get the most out of their university experience. The goal of each FLC is to encourage peer support during the first year of university. FLC students participate in social activities throughout the year and work together to create professional e-portfolios.

LEARNING ACCOMODATION SERVICES
